


Situated on the western tip of Southern Eyre
Peninsula is the idyllic township of Coffin Bay,
approximately 45 kilometres by road northwest of
Port Lincoln. The town overlooks the pristine waters
of Port Douglas, named after Captain Bloomfield
Douglas, which is part of an extensive bay system
that includes Little Douglas, Mount Dutton, Kellidie,
Yangie and Coffin Bays. In these bays you will see
numerous pods of dolphins, whilst some of the
islands are home to seals and many breeding
sea birds. Occasionally, you will see a penguin.
Being surrounded by sea and national parks, this
charming town is a nature lover's delight.

Today it is a beautiful thriving town, one of the few that can boast a steady growth in population and industry (aquaculture) with a permanent population of approximately 650, which swells to over 4,000 in the summer months.

Coffin Bay has an active commercial wharf in the town centre where you can watch the fishing boats unloading their catches, including crayfish, pilchards, ocean jackets and sharks. There are also professional fishermen and abalone divers operating from the boat ramps, and their catches include octopus,

sea urchins, sea snails, scallops, sand crabs, abalone, King George whiting and garfish. At the main boat ramp you will also see the oyster boats returning with baskets of the famous Coffin Bay oysters from the many oyster leases within the bay system.

As the open ocean lies 25 nautical miles from the main wharf, the many protected bays, channels and inlets offer ideal opportunities for fishing and all water activities.





Coffin Bay has all the facilities for you and your family to enjoy nature at its best. There are often kangaroos and emus roaming about the town, so please observe speed limits and take care when driving. All manner of water sports await, including fabulous fishing (boat, beach, rock, and jetty), boating, sailing, canoeing, kayaking, surfing, water skiing, paddle boarding, swimming, snorkelling, diving, and windsurfing.

Check out the walking trails that offer beautiful scenery, and be sure to take in a spectacular sunrise or sunset. There are many places to enjoy some oysters, or other tempting fare, and a drink in a relaxed atmosphere.

Discover the playgrounds, free public barbecues, reserve, tennis courts (key and nets available from the general store), skate park, lawn bowls, or eight ball, or join the kangaroos for a round of golf on the picturesque nine-hole golf course.

There is an IGA supermarket (food, petrol, ice, bait, ATM, etc.), cafe/takeaways (casual dining all

day,) an award-winning restaurant, and two bottle shops, as well as a hotel, pharmacy, community health centre, hairdresser, post office, mechanic, and community church. Oyster tours and boat / kayak / paddle board hire are all available. You will be welcome at both the Yacht Club and the Sporting Club for meals some evenings. The local hall offers a library on Tuesday and Saturday mornings and markets twice a month on Sundays.

There are also plenty of short trips that you can do to such places as Coffin Bay National Park, Kellidie Bay, Wangary, Mount Dutton Bay (café and accommodation), Farm Beach, Little Douglas, Gallipoli Beach, Frenchman Bluff, Coles Point, Greenly Beach, Cummins, Todd Reservoir, Port Lincoln, shark cage diving, wineries, Koppio Smithy Museum, or Glen-Forest Tourist Park, and longer trips to Point Sir Isaac (4WD only), Lincoln National Park, Whalers Way, Halls Bay, Lake Hamilton, Sheringa, Locks Well, Elliston, Talia Caves, and more.



Where to stay

There are many types of accommodation available, including motel units, apartments, holiday homes, quaint shacks, cabins, and powered or unpowered sites at the caravan park. See the map for locations, or go to coffinbay.net for details.

How to get there

It is almost a 700 km drive from Adelaide via Port Augusta or a 40-minute flight from Adelaide to Port Lincoln Airport. Rex Airlines and QantasLink have many flights per day, at competitive prices. Most major car rental companies have vehicles that can be picked up at Port Lincoln Airport, which is just over a 30-minute drive from Coffin Bay.





History of the Name COFFIN BAY

Located 21 kilometres from the township is Coffin Bay, which is part of the Southern Ocean. It was discovered by Lieutenant Matthew Flinders and his crew in the HMS Investigator on 16 February 1802.

On his return to England in 1810, he named the bay after Admiral Sir Isaac Coffin, the Resident Commissioner of Sheerness Naval Dockyards in England, who had been responsible for the outfitting of Flinders' ship, the Investigator, for its imminent voyage to Terra Australis.

Due to weather conditions at the time, Flinders and his crew did not go ashore, although they did see the entrance to the bay system and noticed groups of Aborigines with fires on the beach. It was left to others to investigate these hidden bays many years later.

In March 1839, Captain Frederick Lees charted these bays in the brig Nereus. The main bay was named Port Douglas, after Captain Bloomfield Douglas, who was Harbour Master in Adelaide at the time.

Evidence was found that whalers had been there as far back as 1804. In fact, rabbits were discovered in the area, as it was common practice for whalers to leave rabbits as a food supply for future visits or in case of shipwreck.



The parks range from rocky coastal islands to the mainland with windswept cliffs and sweeping beaches exposed to the might of the Southern Ocean.

This contrasts with the tranquil waters and shores of the bays with spectacular sand dunes and extensive heathlands that give way to dense mallee and remnant sheoak woodland, once the domain of the glossy-black cockatoos.

Coffin Bay National Park, which includes the Whidbey Wilderness Area, takes in the Coffin Bay Peninsula and is the largest park at approximately 31,000 hectares. Many beaches and headlands in this park offer excellent fishing opportunities, but be aware of the unstable cliffs and dangerous seas of the Southern Ocean, with its strong rips, large swells and freak waves.

This park is home to an abundance of birds, wildlife and wildflowers. There are 20 kilometres of sealed road from the entrance to such picturesque places as Point Avoid, Almonta Beach and the new Yangie Bay campground. For the ardent 4WD enthusiast there is the track across the sand dunes to Gunyah Beach, or for the more adventurous a trip to Point Sir Isaac at the tip of the Coffin Bay Peninsula, a six-hour return journey. An information station is located at the entrance to the park. A fee applies to day visitors and campers, and permits may be purchased online. This park was the home of the Coffin Bay ponies, descendants of horses bred in this area as remounts for troops during World War I. The remaining ponies have been relocated to nearby private land.

Kellidie Bay Conservation Park is a much smaller park at 1,786 ha, whilst Mount Dutton Bay



Conservation Park includes Rabbit Island, Goat Island, The Brothers, and six unnamed islands. Whidbey Isles Conservation Park includes three of the four Hummocks Islands, plus Whidbey, Price and Perforated Islands. Avoid Bay Islands Conservation Park consists of Black Rocks and two small, unnamed islands in Avoid Bay. All islands are off limits without written permission from the Department of Environment and Heritage.

These parks conserve more than 250 species of native plant life and over 100 species of native birds, reptiles and mammals.

long after the colony was first established, when native (angasi) oysters were dredged from various bays around the state and shipped to Adelaide to be kept in beds adjacent to hotels, and then sold to the public. In 1849 the price in Adelaide for a dozen Coffin Bay oysters was one shilling and sixpence. By 1870 thirty sailing vessels were dredging for native oysters in the Coffin Bay area. However, overfishing caused a decline in catches, and by 1890 the fishery had all but ceased.

Following the demise of the oyster fishery, attempts were made to farm the native oyster, but because of its slow growth and high mortality it was decided to give the Pacific oyster a go. The Japanese Pacific oyster was first introduced to Tasmania in 1934, but it wasn't until 1969 that they were trialled at Coffin Bay. It was due to the success of that and subsequent trials that the current industry started.

Currently, the oyster farms located in Mount Dutton and Kellidie Bays are mainly used as nursery sites. The majority of the leases are situated 15 kilometres from the town of Coffin Bay, on the sand banks south of Point Longnose, in the waters of Port Douglas. Up to 40 oyster boats can be seen plying the waterways each day, with approximately 100 people being employed either on the leases or back on shore in the sorting sheds.

Oysters start their lives in hatcheries, and oyster farmers buy this spat (or seed) from the hatcheries. Each oyster at this stage is four-to-six millimetres long, and a million seeds only weigh 20 kg. In a good year this seed can increase to weigh 100 tonnes. The oysters are graded back on shore every two-to-four months, depending on the season. Oysters generally reach market size around 18 months of age.

Coffin Bay oysters are sold overseas, but most are sold interstate, with Sydney and Melbourne being the most popular markets. Due to the demand for Coffin Bay oysters, oysters from other growing regions of the state are transported to fattening leases at Point Longnose for up to three months before being sold.



History of Old Oyster Town

It is widely believed that in the year 1849 there were up to thirty cutters dredging native angasi oysters in the bays near Kellidie Bay. This settlement soon became known as Oyster Town.

This small town was established rather quickly. Huts were constructed for the fishermen and their families, who brought various animals and other necessities needed for their survival.

The oyster fishermen of Oyster Town worked all day long, most days until dusk, cleaning the oysters of the foreign matter that grew on their shells, probably discarding them on shore. The oysters were then bedded down, live, in the waters of Kellidie Bay until market day, held every fortnight, when Oyster Town would become a hive of activity.

Up to thirty bullock wagons from Port Lincoln, each drawn by four or six bullocks, two abreast, would travel the 48 km to Oyster Town. Loaded with up to 25 bags, each holding approximately 350 oysters, the wagons would then return to Port Lincoln with the oysters for local consumption and shipment to Port Adelaide, to feed consumers in the new city of Adelaide.

Sadly, as a result of overfishing, the oyster fishery faced an official closure for seven out of nine years between 1882 and 1891, probably contributing to the likely end date to this semi-permanent small settlement.

It is unclear why this native angasi oyster never recovered. Some marine biologists suggest a probable cause is that the fisherman may not have returned their dead oyster shells to the sea, as they would only dredge them up next time, and they probably discarded them on shore. In natural events, dead shells on the ocean floor would provide a solid surface for young oyster spat to attach and grow. In addition to this, spat passing through the dredge would likely have been covered and smothered in dredge silt. These two issues could have contributed to the sudden decline in the native oyster population.

Oyster Town has left little evidence of its existence in the 1840s, and the land is now part of the Kellidie Bay Conservation Park. There are currently two modern shacks situated on the site where Oyster Town once existed.

In 2009 the Oyster Walk was extended to Old Oyster Town. Refer Oyster Walk on town map, page 12-13.



Wangary

Established in the late 1800s to service the local community, today it houses the Lake Wangary Primary School and Lake Wangary Pre-school, which cater for the surrounding area. Also, you will find the lovely Anglican church built in 1900 with its bell tower, the old hotel built in 1871, and the ruins of the old post office, coach house and bakery. Wangary is home to the Marble Range Community & Sporting Centre, with oval, tennis and netball courts.

settlement, Oyster Town, arose. The bay is the home to modern oyster leases and on-shore operations.

Mount Dutton Bay

Situated to the west of Wangary is the settlement of Mount Dutton Bay, which has a modern boat ramp and boat-hire business, Heritage-listed jetty and a wool shed built in 1875 that is now a museum and cafe. Accommodation includes a caravan park and holiday homes.

Farm Beach

The trip to Farm Beach is worthwhile, with a spectacular beach and nearby campground.

The beach is usually firm enough to drive on and is ideal for boat launching in the summer months.

A great spot for swimming, picnics and beach or rock fishing. A scenic four-kilometre drive north along the cliff-tops will take you to Gallipoli Beach, where the movie Gallipoli, starring Mel Gibson, was filmed.

Little Douglas

Originally a fishermen's settlement, Little Douglas lies near the opening between Coffin Bay and Port Douglas. As it is close to the main oyster leases, it has in recent years seen land-based oyster facilities established. Most professional crab and line fishermen also launch here. It features a protected little bay with views across the water revealing the extensive oyster leases, the main shipping channel, and the Coffin Bay National Park and Peninsula, with Point Longnose being prominent.







Special permits are required from the District Council of Lower Eyre Peninsula. Consider incorporating a celebration with a nature immersive experience or tour. Coffin Bay has something to suit a simple celebration to the more decorative, on land or water. Various accommodation options are available.
